CEPI – the Confederation of European Paper industries - has expanded its offer on statistics packages. Next to a full set of 'Annual Statistics' from the European pulp and paper industry, which includes country data as well as production figures, CEPI now offers several new packages including a quarterly and even monthly package of statistics. The packages can be combined in a very flexible way. Four different statistics packages are available, which were created to meet the needs of stakeholders from the pulp and paper industry.

Every year CEPI publishes its 'Preliminary Statistics' in February and the 'Key Statistics' in June, which are free of charge. Next to these publications the additional statistics packages offer closer monitoring possibilities and more timely observation of trends.
